Anti-Bullying Week

Anti-Bullying Week, which is coordinated by the Northern Ireland Anti-Bullying Forum, takes place on the week beginning 11th November 2019. The focus of Anti-Bullying Week 2019 is on the theme 'Change Starts With Us'.



'Odd Socks Day' forms part of Anti-Bullying Week. It is a chance to celebrate that we are all unique. Millions of children and adults will be taking part across the country.

On Tuesday 12th November the children can wear ODD Socks to school. This day sends an important message to people that they should be allowed to be themselves, free from bullying, and helps us celebrate Anti-Bullying Week in a fun and positive way.

Throughout the week the children in each class will be using resources from the forum. There will be presentations, assemblies and workshops to highlight the important message that bullying of all kinds is wrong.

During this week we will also, as part of our consultation process, ask parents to complete a questionnaire on bullying. This consultation is important as there is a new Anti Bullying Act that has been passed in N.I. but is currently on hold by the Dept of Education due to industrial Action.

Strabane/Derry Culture Quarter

The Yr 4/7 children will avail of a workshop called An Introduction to Russia' on **Tuesday 12th November**. This workshop raises awareness about Russian culture and traditions. The workshops consist of a presentation introducing the pupils to Russia, it's famous cities, traditions, food, celebrations and language. Milk, Music and Meals fees

In order to reduce administrative time in the collection of fees for milk and music etc where we originally had five charging periods we will now use three periods only. The current period will run from Halloween to St Patrick's Day. Prompt payment of these fees will also reduce administration time. The amounts are as follows:

Milk fee: £15.60 per child Music Fee: £12.80 per child

It has been noted that payments for meals have not been received in a timely manner. We would appreciate if these were paid on a weekly basis.

Payment in cheques

The Education Authority has asked us to inform those parents who use cheques that payments for milk and music fees **must be paid for in separate cheques**. The milk and music accounts are separate and monies for these must be lodged as such. When we receive a cheque for both milk and music combined there is a considerable difficulty in the administration process here in the school and at the EA offices to make sure payments are logged accurately.

Shoe Box Appeal

We will continue to donate a gift to someone in need and by filling a shoebox with simple things you can bring a smile to someone this Christmas. Leaflets will be sent home in your child's bag giving more information. Last year 81 shoe boxes were returned with the comminity getting involved too - so spread the word.
